Build a coffee station

A designated coffee area in your home is a coffee drinker's dream. It allows you to play barista for your family and friends and is a convenient way to keep all your coffee related paraphernalia in one place. A home coffee station can be as simple as a countertop drip coffee maker with a few handy mugs or as sophisticated as a built-in high-end specialty coffee maker with a dedicated water filtration system. 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Types of kitchen lighting

Today's kitchens have become gathering and entertaining places but they are first and foremost where food is prepared. A well-lit kitchen has layers of lighting to make the space warm and inviting as well as a functional place to cook. When making a kitchen lighting plan, consider the three types of lighting: ambient, task and accent.

Ambient Also called general lighting, this is the light that fills a room and usually from the ceiling. The most popular ambient light source for kitchens is recessed lighting because of its unobtrusive look. An upcoming trend is small flush or semi-flush light fixtures in a simple style and strategically placed throughout the kitchen. It should be noted that ambient lighting from above creates shadows on the work surfaces below.

Task These lights are for lighting specific work areas in the kitchen and may be the most important for those preparing food. Task lighting includes lighting over an island or peninsula, under cabinet lighting and a light source over the stove and sink. Because the kitchen is a functional space, this type of lighting is key. Task lighting in the form of pendant lighting or chandeliers gives you an opportunity to add style to the kitchen.

Accent Out of the three types of lighting, this type of lighting is the least used in the kitchen. Accent lighting is meant to draw attention to the light fixture itself and not to perform a function. This could be in the form of wall sconces or fixtures that light up artwork.

Hold install a kitchen faucet



Replacing a kitchen faucet is a small DIY project that has big impact. Start by looking underneath the sink to find out how many holes in the sink your existing faucet has. This determines the type of kitchen faucet to purchase. You can install a single handle faucet in a three or four hole sink by adding a deck plate but not vice-versa. The same rule applies if you are installing your new faucet into the countertop. Be sure to read the faucet manufacturer's installation guide before you start.

Prep for installation Clear everything out of the cabinet below the sink. Have a towel and shallow bucket on hand for any dripping water. Also, use a flashlight so you can see what you are doing.

Shut off water Turn the water off at the supply valves under the sink. If you don't have supply valves, shut off the water to the whole house. Before you go further, take a picture of the existing connections in case you need it for future reference. Next, open up the existing faucet to relieve pressure on the lines, then disconnect the supply lines. This is when the bucket and towel may come in handy.

Remove old faucet This is the tricky part of the process. The old faucet is bolted to the sink or countertop at the back of the cabinet. It's a tight space and removing the connections is difficult. The best tool for the job is a basin wrench and if you don't have one you may want to purchase one. It is designed to grip in hard-to-reach areas and will save you a lot of aggravation. Have someone hold the old faucet in place from above while you remove the nuts holding the faucet below. Once the old faucet is gone, clean up the area.

Install new faucet Manufacturer's will provide step-bystep installation instructions. Note that each manufacturer will have a slightly different set up. Basically, if you are using a deck plate, set it up first. If not, go to the next step and feed the new faucet's supply lines through the hole(s). Attach the new faucet to the sink or countertop at the back with included washers and nuts. Next, if your new faucet has a pull-down faucet feature, attach the quickconnect hose to the supply pipe and attach the weight. When done, connect each water supply line to the corresponding water supply valve. Turn the water on and check for leaks. If you detect any drips, tighten the connections (but don't over tighten). When lines are good to go, remove the aerator from the faucet and let the lines run for a couple minutes to remove any accumulated debris. Turn the faucet off and replace the aerator.

Make a splash with colour

Plumbing fixtures: What's

Plumbing fixture styles for 2025 continue to be sleek and contemporary and in an assortment of finishes. Smart faucets can include touchless operation, temperature indicators and even voice control. There are kitchen faucets that include a push-button water filtration system through two separate water channels, one for cold filtered water, the other for hot and cold tap water. Water efficiency to reduce water consumption has improved over the last few years. Some eco-friendly shower heads use up to 30 percent less water while kitchen and vanity faucets can use up to 45 percent less water, and both without sacrificing performance. Replacing a drippy shower head is a simple DIY weekend project that will improve your shower experience. The style and finish should match the other plumbing fixtures in your bathroom but you will have to decide how you want your shower head to function. There are 2 categories of shower heads, fixed and hand-held. These can be installed individually or as part of a shower system which usually includes fixed and hand-held shower heads, body sprays and volume controls. There are pre-packaged shower systems or you can customize your own. There are shower heads specifically designed for low water pressure, reducing your water bill and the amount of hot water used with each shower. There are also many shower head functions to choose from including a powerful spray, gentle rainshower or pulsating massage.

What to do with a large bathroom

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Traditionally, bathrooms have been small spaces and homeowners have had to get creative to maximize every centimeter. Today, people want large spa-like bathrooms they can spend time in. The trouble is, a bathroom is a functional space and you run the risk of having a cavernous room with not much in it except a lot of exposed floor. So how do you use up all that space? A large shower with a substantial freestanding tub is a good place to start. Be careful not to make the shower too big or it won't warm up during the shower and you'll be shivering the minute you step out of the water. Consider a water closet for the toilet which involves building a separate room within the bathroom just for the toilet. Design your bathroom with two large vanities, each with one sink, instead of one double vanity. Adding storage to your bathroom is a practical solution and often cabinet makers offer additional cabinetry that match the style of the vanity. You can also opt for a built-in linen cabinet with glass doors for displaying stacks of towels and pretty objects. A closet built within the bathroom or a favourite free-standing armoire is a great place to store bath products and cleaning supplies. You can also create a separate makeup vanity with room for a bench. Make the most of your large bathroom space by making sure the scale of the fixtures fit the size of the space and use colour and decor to make it warm and inviting.
